1. Do I get any certificate at the end of the training Programme?

Yes, you will get a duly signed certificate at the end of the training Programme.

2. Is there any selection criteria or short listing for this training Programme ?

No, this is an open training programme which is on first come first served basis. If you are applying through the online portal fulfilling all the required criteria mentioned in the online form then you are eligible and automatically selected to attend the training programme. 3. What will be content of this training programme?

Those who are opting for all the modules will get extensive theoretical and practical sessions in 10 days time. Also they will get to know about various aspects of Bioinformatics and the participants will do lot of things on their own with the help of the SCFBio's resource persons. Experts from IIT Delhi, JNU, Delhi Univ., NII, ICGB, NIPGR, Daiichi Sankyo will be there to deliver talks in the area of Genomics, Proteomics and Drug Design during the programme. The students can connect the things which they might have learnt from text books with the application that they will experience during hands-on session of the programme.

4. How it is different from other training Programmes?

The focus of this training programme is not only to impart theoretical knowledge on the participants rather we focus on application side of Bioinformatics where we encourage participants to develop tools/ software and not just be mere users of Bioinformatics tools for their research. Our aim is that after attending the training programme each participant will be able to understand the difference between Bioinformatics perspective "User vs. Developer" and can take initiatives on their own to develop original software.

5. Can I get a seat in the preferred/opted batch?

Yes, in case there is over capacity in one batch we shift participants (rarely) to other batch but not without their consent.
